From The President's Desk




You make a living by what you getyou make a life by what you give.

Dues Assessments

The fourth quarter payment for 2023 was due October 1, 2023. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on November 1st if dues are not paid on time. Association dues assessments are payable on or before the first day of a given quarter. To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.

Call to Order: 6:04 PM

Roll Call: Sign in Sheet. Present: Maria Brush, Larry Sansone, Georgine Natelli, James Conway, Ed Menzenbach, Marybethe McGill, Brian Kochera, Diane Crozier, Shirleyan Emmons, Susan Fletcher. Excused absence: Mary Nye

Procedural Rules: This meeting is held in accordance with the SRPW Governing Documents and Roberts Rules of Order and is being recorded. Notice of this meeting was announced in the Sentinel and the Asbury Park Press.

Minutes of Preceding Meeting: Motion to approve the Minutes of the August 14, 2023 Meeting was made by Marybethe McGill; seconded by Brian Kochera. All in favor. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Motion to accept the Financials dated August 31, 2023 as presented by James Conway made by Larry Sansone; seconded by Brian Kochera. All in favor. Motion carried.

Homeowner Q & A:

Curbs in front of the common ground need mowing. Vice President will contact Greenleaf to mow.

The deer situation, code issues, speeding, and squatters – Maria will address this with Berkeley Township at the next Town Hall.

Congratulations to the Board for the two nights we celebrated outside.

Deer situation: Berkeley Township needs to realize that it is a very serious problem. The deer create safety issues for cars; it is not just a foliage issue.

Neighborhood Watch is trying to hold a town meeting in November where animal control, the state wildlife agency and the mayor will be present to address concerns.

Recess: 5 minutes

NEW BUSINESS

President's Report:

By-Laws Committee Update – The Committee meets monthly. The By Laws need to be updated. Last meeting, the By Laws Committee discussed the trustee section. Sections 1, 2, 3 and 11 have no trustees. Some ideas for revision: remove sections altogether or combine sections. Fifteen board members is an unmanageable number for an association this size. Homeowners will be kept informed. Before any changes, the revisions will go for Attorney Review and a vote to the Homeowners.

Trustee Appointment: Not discussed.

Flippers: The house across the street -- work was stopped on it, and the door frame was kicked in. We are working on that. 18 Bolingbroke: We recently discovered that the house is sold and the owners did not come through compliance. The house is in awful disrepair – we and the codes department from Berkeley have all been on it. We are following the money and starting to recoup money from Willoughby. **Second Annual HOA Barbecue** was funded by the rebate we get from the new publisher. The cost did not come from the dues account. As long as the Sentinel is operational, relevant, and important— our only official source of information – we will be recouping this kind of money.

Vice President Report:

Facilities Project Update: Motion to approve the HVAC contract with Toms River Heating and Air Conditioning made by Brian Kochera; seconded by Ed Menzenbach. All in favor. Motion carried. It is a one-year contract that provides for service in the Spring and the Fall.

Engineering Report: The inspection of the building, building grounds and common ground occurred last week. It will take 30-45 days for the report to be issued.

Stage Lighting: Lighting collapsed about a month ago. The new fixtures are in, and they will be installed. **Kitchen Downstairs**: There is a slight cost for finishing the kitchen because of the mold remediation. Tom will be repairing, adding shelves, and installing the ice maker.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October – We will be acknowledging it by putting some things outside the building.

Phone System is up and running. A homeowner calls one phone number to reach everyone -- volunteers, clubs, trustees, officers. Call the clubhouse and respond to the prompt. You can dial by extension, section name, or club name and you will be connected to the person you want to speak with. The October Sentinel will explain the procedure and the contact pages will contain extension numbers. Personal phone numbers will no longer be included in the Sentinel. This gives our volunteers a little more security and, when there is a change of volunteers, you will still get whoever is the contact person. This will make your and our lives easier.

Secretary's Report:

Newsletter Update: New features include "Yard of the Month" where a trustee picks a home in his/her section that beautifies our community, and Happy Birthday which honors milestone birthdays for our neighbors 80 years and older. Neighborhood Watch has contributed multiple types of information that deal with your safety.

Correspondence: We received Thank You Notes from two families for our support when they needed comfort. Thank you to our Sunshine Team and other members of the community who cooked food and performed other kindnesses for our members.

Treasurer's Report: The payment plan approval that was on the agenda has been suspended and will not be considered tonight.

Events: Shred It Event -- Put boxes, tubs, or bags of shredding in your car and pull up to the machine.

Common Ground: Brian's Tree Service has finished the last items on the approved list. We are working on a current list for future tree cutting. The Common Grounds Committee spent three weekends working on the common ground at the corner of Northumberland and Whitmore. We work from 8-9 on Saturday morning. We work until the trailer is full, which, sometimes, is 25-30 minutes. Homeowners are starting to help us gather smaller branches and debris, so it is easier for us to load. This saves homeowners money and ensures that the common ground can get mowed properly. There was discussion about getting a larger trailer that would belong to the Homeowners' Association would be parked in the back of the building. This is something to think about for next year's budget. Maria would like to maintain the HOA fees to its current amount for one more year. We have the lowest fees of all the communities.

Compliance: Things are slowing down a bit.

Health and Welfare: Flea Market raised \$250 for our Food Bank. The Shred It event is this weekend. We are contacting possible future speakers, such as representatives from Deborah Hospital. We have planned a tree lighting and have invited the chorus to sing – treats and a tree.

Neighborhood Watch: The Nov. 14th meeting will hopefully be a Town Meeting, so we will have speakers from various Berkeley Township agencies. There have been coyote sightings; keep your dogs on a leash. If you see something, say something: report to the police first, then let Neighborhood Watch know so they can document.

Alternate Dispute Resolution: Nothing to report.

Maria Brush thanked the recently revitalized and extremely helpful Men's Club for helping at the flea market and the barbecue.

Event Club: Next event is Oct. 28, the Halloween party. Tickets are \$20. The Event Club has received their raffle license approval. Upcoming events: Tricky Tray and Food Bank Zingo.

One more activity: Tai Chi on Wednesdays with Vicki Kohanek from 6:15-7:15 pm. Tai Chi is good for balance and the nervous system. Cost is \$7/week or \$20/month. You can just show up if you don't have time to give her a call.

SENIOR FREEZE Property Tax Reimbursement 2022 Eligibility Requirements

Eligibility requirements, including Income limits, and benefits available under this program are subject to change by the State Budget.

In order to receive a reimbursement for the difference between the amount of property taxes paid for **2021** and **2022** you must meet the following requirements:

You (or your spouse/civil union partner) were:

• 65 or older as of **December 31, 2021**, or, actually receiving federal Social Security disability benefit payments (not benefit payments received on behalf of someone else) on or before **December 31, 2021**;

• Have lived in New Jersey continuously since **December 31, 2011**, or earlier, as either a homeowner or a renter; and

• You have owned and lived in your home (or have leased a site in a mobile home park for a manufactured or mobile home that you own) since **December 31, 2018**, or earlier (and you still owned and lived in the home on **December 31, 2022**; and

Have paid the full amount of the property taxes due on the home for **2021** by **June 1, 2022**, and for **2022** by **June 1, 2023** and

• Your total annual income for **2021** did not exceed **\$94,178** and for **2022** did not exceed **\$99,735**.

Note: With very few exceptions, all income received during the year must be taken into account to determine eligibility (including social security, pension income, etc.)

Eligibility requirements, including Income limits, and benefits available under this program are subject to change by the State Budget.

Filing deadline on or before October 31, 2023.

Important Program Changes Coming Next Year

P.L. 2023, c.75 which was signed into law June 30, 2023, expands the income limit and simplifies the residency requirements for new Senior Freeze program applicants.

Beginning with the 2023 filing season, the law:

- Increases the income limit for the program to \$150,000; and
- Eliminates the requirement that an applicant must be a New Jersey resident for 10 consecutive years.

The age/disability and three-year homeownership requirements remain unchanged.

Medicare Annual Enrollment Period 2023

The Medicare Annual Enrollment Period occurs each year from

October 15 to December 7.

What Changes Can I Make During the Medicare Annual Enrollment Period?

- Switch from <u>Medicare Advantage</u> to Original Medicare

New Phone System

If you called the clubhouse recently, you heard a new greeting message. On September 6, 2023 we switched over to a new 5G phone system with all the latest bells and whistles. This new system benefits homeowners in several ways.

First, you will only have to call ONE NUMBER to get to any of the volunteers working in and for the HOA. That number is 732-244-1484.

Second, you can direct your call to the person that you are looking for.

Third, you will NOT have to remember the name of the person you are looking for since the phone system will prompt you for the officer title, trustee section number, club name or committee name.

As an example, if you have a question about your dues, you can call the Treasurer directly from the main menu and one sub menu or if you know his extension you can dial it directly at extension 104. If Jim is not available and you leave a message, he will receive both a missed call message and an email message which he can reply to when he returns to the office. There will be no need to relay a message through the office staff.

For trustees, Clubs and Committees, you will be asked to enter the three-digit extension (listed in this Sentinel) and the phone system will direct the call to that volunteer's personal telephone number.

In addition to the one-digit prompts, there is also a dial-by-name feature that will allow the caller to enter the first three letters of the first or last name of the officers or first three letters of the **Trustee section number**, Club **name** or Committee **name** and the system will provide you a list of options that meet the callers input.

When you get a chance, try it out and share your experience with us and your friends and neighbors.

WHEN SHOULD YOU CONTACT YOUR TRUSTEE?

- 1. You have a question.
- 2. You are looking for a resource.
- 3. You have a suggestion about changes you would like to see in the running of our community, activities in our community, etc.
- 4. You see a violation of our covenants, by-laws, or rules and regulations.
- 5. You would like to give a compliment on a job well done.

Your trustee represents you and your wishes at the monthly Board of Trustees business meetings. Please let your representative know your concerns. If your section does not have a trustee, please call the office with your suggestion or concern. If your section does not have a trustee, please consider becoming a trustee for your section.

SPEEDING:

REMEMBER: SPEED LIMIT IS 25 MPH. PLEASE OBSERVE THE SPEED POSTINGS..

PARKING ON LAWNS

Parking on your property, in other than the designated driveway area, is prohibited. Designated driveway means the area that is paved for the purpose of parking your vehicle. During a snowstorm, you may temporarily move your car to a non-designated driveway area on your property in order to comply with Berkeley Township's requirement that you clear the streets for the snowplows.

SANITATION

Garbage is NOT to be put out before 4:00 PM on Tuesday for Wednesday pickup. Recycling is NOT to be put out before 4:00 PM every other Wednesday for Thursday pickup. If you are going away, please ask a friend or neighbor to put it out for you. This is a Berkeley Township ordinance and violators may be fined by the Township.

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CLUBHOUSE PARKING

Parking in the Clubhouse parking lot while away on a trip is limited to members only. When an Association member plans to leave a car in the Clubhouse parking lot while away on a trip, the office must be advised and provided with dates of trip, license plate number, make of car and proof of insurance. All vehicles left in the parking lot must be parked in the parking spaces nearest Westbrook Drive. Nonassociation members are not permitted to leave their cars in the parking lot while away on a trip. This, of course, applies to trips only and does not apply to non-association members who are attending events at the Clubhouse.

CLUBHOUSE USE

The Clubhouse is available for use by sanctioned clubs and committees for their events and meetings. In order to reserve space for meetings or events, an authorized club or committee member must complete a written calendar request and present it to the Vice President by email or in person. The Vice President will determine if the date and time is available. If the date and time is available, the event will be placed on the calendar.

Residents, only, may rent the hall for private parties. In order to do so, the resident should call the Rental Clubhouse number on p. 3 of the Sentinel to get appropriate instructions.

The downstairs game room and the library are open to all residents during clubhouse hours, Monday through Friday 10 am to 5 pm, and Saturday, 10 am to 1 pm. You may walk in at any time during those hours.

Entry to the Clubhouse building at hours other than the posted clubhouse hours must be supervised by a member of the Board of Trustees.

COYOTES

Please be aware that coyotes have been sighted in the common grounds surrounding our homes. Be vigilant of small pets and young children when they are outside.

GARAGE/YARD SALES

Residents may hold garage or yard sales only within the confines of resident's own garage or driveway and are limited to two (2) per year. No "Garage Sale," or "Yard Sale," advertisements are to be posted on utility poles or township signs and all signs must be removed immediately after the event. Note: Before holding a garage or yard sale, you must register it with the Township Clerk's Office; this is a Berkeley Township ordinance.

EXTERIOR PROPERTY IMPROVEMENT

All changes to your property that are visible to the exterior must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association before work can commence. You will need Architectural Control approval before you can obtain Berkeley Township permits where permits are required. Please complete the appropriate forms for your project and submit them to Architectural Control through the office. You may present the forms in person or send them via email. You may obtain the forms by visiting the office or by going to our new website srpwest.us. You can find the forms and instructions for Architectural Control in the Forms/Resources section of the website.

PET OWNERSHIP – SRPWHOA REQUIREMENTS

BERKELEY TOWNSHIP REQUIREMENTS Domestic pets

Berkeley Township requires the licensing of every dog and cat. The license period runs from January to January and must be renewed every year. There is a minimum \$25.00 fine for failure to license. **Dogs:**

Dog owners are prohibited from allowing their dogs to soil any lawn or property of any person other than the person who owns or has custody of the dog.

Dog owners may not keep a dog that habitually barks, cries or howls between the hours of 10 pm and 6 am. Dog owners must keep a dog on a leash not more than 6 feet long.

A fine of \$500 can be assessed for violation of these provisions. Go to this link for more detail on the Berkeley Township requirements for dog ownership. https://ecode360.com/35651810

Cats:

Do not feed a stray cat unless you ensure that it is spayed/neutered and inoculated for rabies. The Township can assess fines up to \$500 for violation of this provision.

Your cat must remain on your property and may not cause a nuisance to other residents.

Wildlife:

Berkeley Township prohibits the feeding of wildlife, including geese and ducks. Birds are the only wildlife that homeowners can feed as long as proper bird feeders are used.


- 1. Rated ABC Type 2A:10B:C
- 2. Must be mounted and visible within 10 feet of the kitchen. Fire extinguisher can't be blocked by furniture, storage or other items, and cannot be placed inside enclosed areas. It must be accompanied by an owner's manual.
- 3. The top of the fire extinguisher cannot be higher than five (5) feet above the floor.
- 4. Fire extinguisher must be near a room exit or travel way that provides an escape route to the exterior.



No construction permit shall be issued for the alteration of the exterior of any residence or addition to such residence, or construction of accessory structures located within any planned residential retirement community, unless the application for such permit is accompanied by a written statement issued by the association organized under subsection 35-101.12 of this section, indicating whether the association has approved the proposed improvement. In the absence of such approval the Construction Official may if otherwise required to issue the permit pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code note on the permit that the applicant must obtain such approval before beginning construction.







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It's always fun to pick a colorful subject. Bright colorful images are pleasing to the eye. While a colorful subject is a good element to have, to get an exceptional image you need to follow the other rules of composition. Having your colorful subject in a great composition will yield an image you'll be proud to show others.

Where can you find that image with a lot of color? Almost anywhere, but I like farm markets, parades, fairs, flower gardens, etc.

A great way to enhance your images is by using a polarizing filter. This filter works the same as polarizing sunglasses – it is designed to cut glare and reflections. Removing the glare makes the colors brighter and more saturated. Simply rotate the polarizing filter until the sky or shiny objects are at their darkest.
