



Dues Assessments

The first quarter payment for 2024 will be due on February 1,2024. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on November 1st if dues are not paid on time. Association dues assessments are payable on or before the first day of a given quarter. To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.

Call to Order: Time 6:00 pm

Roll Call: Sign-in Sheet. Present: Larry Sansone, Georgine Natelli, James Conway, Ed Menzenbach, Brian Kochera, Diane Crozier, Shirleyan Emmons, Susan Fletcher. Excused Absence: Maria Brush, Marybethe McGill

Procedural Rules: Posted. Read into the minutes by Larry Sansone. This meeting is held in accordance with the SRPW Governing Documents and Roberts Rules of Order, and is being recorded. Notice of this meeting was announced in the Sentinel and in the Asbury Park Press.

Minutes of Preceding Meeting: Motion to approve the minutes from the September 11, 2023 Board of Trustees Meeting made by Diane Crozier; seconded by Brian Kochera. All in favor. Motion carried.

Homeowner Q & A: A homeowner asked the board to take action to invest our money in higher yield investments.

NEW BUSINESS:

President's Report by Larry Sansone, VP:

By Laws Committee Update: This committee meets the first Friday every month. They are making progress and hope to present something for Board Review at the January meeting.

Flipper Update: A home on Bolingbroke was in disrepair and occupied by squatters. The squatters were removed. We finally tracked down the LLC that owned the property and finally spoke to the owner. WE are trying to get him into compliance and collect the money owed the association.

Library Update: Upgrade to library, change out some furniture with some donated furniture. The library is being used more, so we want to spruce it up a bit.

Vice President's Report

Facilities Project Update:

The lights over the stage have been replaced and are working.

The solar contract – still trying to get a copy; four panels are not operating.

HVAC – Toms River HVAC last week serviced and inspected, changed filters, checked zones and thermostats, treatment on boilers. Officers okayed ordering of two kits to do service work that has not been done for years on the boilers. The service needs to be done and will be an additional cost.

Exterminator -- Motion to approve renewal of Ozane Contract which expired 9/2023 made by Susan Fletcher; seconded by Brian Kochera. All in favor. Motion carried.

Pump Repair – There was a back-up in the basement because of a clog in the line. We hired a company to clear the line and they found that the ejector pump for the sewer was broken. It had to be replaced and cost \$3,412.91

Clubhouse Rental – We are looking into revising the resident rental agreement for the clubhouse.

Parking Lot Rental – We are looking into renting spaces in the parking lot for trailers.

Petition – Please sign the petition against a proposed bill that will affect our 55 and over status.

Engineering Study is expected on the 23rd of October.

Newsletter/website update – Susan reported that there was an issue with the website not being updated. We will reach out to Bill.

Correspondence – Thank you note for the wonderful picnic sent by a picnic attendee.

Treasurer's Report:

Financials ending September 30, 2023 presented by James Conway. Motion to accept the financials made by Shirleyan Emmons; seconded by Susan Fletcher. All in favor. Motion carried.



COVID FACTS: WHEN AM I MOST CONTAGIOUS?

WHEN YOU TEST POSITIVE for Covid, you surely know by now that you can pass the virus along to others. But you might be unsure exactly how contagious you are at different stages of the illness—and when you're no longer contagious.

"Well, that's a great question, because most of our studies where we looked at how long people shed live virus, which is infectious, were with earlier variants," says Thomas Russo, M.D., an infectious disease expert and professor at the University at Buffalo. "We don't have any data on the circulating variants."

But many of the general guidelines still apply, he says. You're typically most contagious when your viral load is the highest, which research has shown to be day four after symptoms started. And the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says you may still be contagious for up to 10 days.

Covid continues to circulate, and new variants will likely continue to emerge. Dr. Russo says that means it's still infectious and transmissible.

Cases will also probably go up heading into winter when the cooler temperatures keep people indoors in poorly ventilated spaces where the virus can easily spread, he adds. Plus, Covid is floating around along with the flu, and it's possible to get both illnesses at the same time—so it's important to get the updated Covid vaccine and flu shot.

As Director of Deborah's Vascular Surgery Department, Dr. Domer oversees a highly specialized team which focuses on the arteries and veins that circulate blood and lymph throughout the body. Keeping the circulatory system healthy and free of blockages, and repairing diseased and decayed arteries, is critical for a healthy cardiac system.

Of particular concern is the carotid artery, which connects the blood flow between the heart and the brain. Blockages here can cause stroke and other serious medical problems. Dr. Domer's team specializes in a variety of treatment options targeting the carotid, and recently celebrated a milestone - performing the 100th TCAR (Transcarotid Artery Revascularization) surgery at Deborah.



TCAR is a minimally invasive procedure to clear blockages and open a narrowed carotid artery. The surgeon makes an incision over the artery, reverses the blood flow in the area of the blockage, and then uses a surgical balloon and stents to reopen the narrowed artery, restoring blood flow. TCAR is the next evolution approach to clearing the carotid artery, reducing a patient's risk of a stroke.

Dr. Domer's additional interests include vascular and endovascular surgery and aortic disease. He is also especially skilled in preserving limbs while repairing complex peripheral blockages, and ensuring that the vascular system is protected when surgery is required to create access for long-term dialysis care.







PARKING ON LAWNS

Parking on your property, in other than the designated driveway area, is prohibited. Designated driveway means the area that is paved for the purpose of parking your vehicle. During a snowstorm, you may temporarily move your car to a non-designated driveway area on your property in order to comply with Berkeley Township's requirement that you clear the streets for the snowplows.

SANITATION

Garbage is NOT to be put out before 4:00 PM on Tuesday for Wednesday pickup. Recycling is NOT to be put out before 4:00 PM every other Wednesday for Thursday pickup. If you are going away, please ask a friend or neighbor to put it out for you. This is a Berkeley Township ordinance and violators may be fined by the Township.



CLUBHOUSE PARKING

Parking in the Clubhouse parking lot while away on a trip is limited to members only. When an Association member plans to leave a car in the Clubhouse parking lot while away on a trip, the office must be advised and provided with dates of trip, license plate number, make of car and proof of insurance. All vehicles left in the parking lot must be parked in the parking spaces nearest Westbrook Drive. Non-association members are not permitted to leave their cars in the parking lot while away on a trip. This, of course, applies to trips only and does not apply to non-association members who are attending events at the Clubhouse.

CLUBHOUSE USE

The Clubhouse is available for use by sanctioned clubs and committees for their events and meetings. In order to reserve space for meetings or events, an authorized club or committee member must complete a written calendar request and present it to the Vice President by email or in person. GARAGE/YARD SALES

Residents may hold garage or yard sales only within the confines of resident's own garage or driveway and are limited to two (2) per year. Note: Before holding a garage or yard sale, you must register it with the Township Clerk's Office; this is a Berkeley Township ordinance.

EXTERIOR PROPERTY IMPROVEMENT

All changes to your property that are visible to the exterior must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association before work can commence. You will need Architectural Control approval before you can obtain Berkeley Township permits where permits are required. IMPORTANT NOTICES

PET OWNERSHIP AND WILDLIFE BERKELEY TOWNSHIP REQUIREMENTS Domestic pets

Berkeley Township requires the licensing of every dog and cat. The license period runs from January to January and must be renewed every year. There is a minimum \$25.00 fine for failure to license.

Dogs:

Dog owners are prohibited from allowing their dogs to soil any lawn or property of any person other than the person who owns or has custody of the dog.

Dog owners may not keep a dog that habitually barks, cries or howls between the hours of 10 pm and 6 am. Dog owners must keep a dog on a leash not more than 6 feet long.

A fine of \$500 can be assessed for violation of these provisions. Go to this link for more detail on the Berkeley Township requirements for dog ownership. https://ecode360.com/35651810

Cats:

Do not feed a stray cat unless you ensure that it is spayed/neutered and inoculated for rabies. The Township can assess fines up to \$500 for violation of this provision.

Your cat must remain on your property and may not cause a nuisance to other residents.

Wildlife:

Berkeley Township prohibits the feeding of wildlife, including geese and ducks. Birds are the only wildlife that homeowners can feed as long as proper bird feeders are used.

- 1. Rated ABC Type 2A:10B:C
- 2. Must be mounted and visible within 10 feet of the kitchen. Fire extinguisher can't be blocked by furniture, storage or other items, and cannot be placed inside enclosed areas. It must be accompanied by an owner's manual.
- 3. The top of the fire extinguisher cannot be higher than five (5) feet above the floor.
- 4. Fire extinguisher must be near a room exit or travel way that provides an escape route to the exterior.

No construction permit shall be issued for the alteration of the exterior of any residence or addition to such residence, or construction of accessory structures located within any planned residential retirement community, unless the application for such permit is accompanied by a written statement issued by the association organized under subsection 35-101.12 of this section, indicating whether the association has approved the proposed improvement. In the absence of such approval the Construction Official may if otherwise required to issue the permit pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code note on the permit that the applicant must obtain such approval before beginning construction.


